This policy is based on **The Six Principles of Safeguarding** that underpin all adult safeguarding work: -

Empowerment	People being supported and encouraged to make their own decisions and give informed consent
Prevention	It is better to take action before harm occurs
Proportionate	The least intrusive response appropriate to the risk presented
Protection	Support and representation for those in greatest need
Partnerships	Local solutions through services working with their communities – communities have a part to play in preventing, detecting and reporting neglect and abuse
Accountable	Accountability and transparency in safeguarding practice

2. Policy Explanation:

Anyone who has experienced abuse and or neglect or has fears about exploitation or radicalisation will be able to raise the issue with a member of staff at MFRS in the knowledge that the matter will be treated seriously and sympathetically in accordance with this policy.

MF&RA is committed to working in partnership with all relevant stakeholders to provide a safe and supportive environment free from the risk of abuse and neglect for any adult or child at risk with whom MF&RA engages.

Safeguarding:

Everyone working within MF&RA, either in a paid or voluntary capacity, has a role to play in safeguarding children and adults and preventing the abuse of those who may be vulnerable. Staff may have contact with vulnerable adults and children can be a very important link in identifying cases where a vulnerable adult or child requires safeguarding.

Staff must always act on any suspected or potential case of abuse by reporting directly and without delay.

Allegations of Abuse made against Members of Staff:

Any allegations of abuse made against members of staff will be dealt with using MF&RA internal procedures.

Confidentiality:

Managers or officers cannot provide an absolute guarantee of confidentiality in all circumstances where 'vulnerable adult or child at risk' issues are raised. In these circumstances, the manager or

Officer should inform the person that she/he would be referring the matter to a Designated Officer within the Service for further guidance.

MF&RA will support anyone who, in good faith, reports his or her concerns that an adult, young person or child is being abused or is at risk of abuse, even if those concerns prove to be unfounded. See MF&RA data sharing policy.

3. Policy Implementation:

The NFCC Safeguarding Position Statement and the Fire Standards Board (Safeguarding Fire Standards) have been considered as part of this Policy.
